

Craft Training Center -

The Craft Training Center of the Coastal Bend has developed a summer school camp, "The Future of America", to work with Junior High/Middle School Students (Grades 6, 7, 8) in order to provide hands-on activities in Construction Trade areas. The emphasis of the summer school program will be on Career Awareness, Math, Science and Safety applications in the following areas: Industrial Career Exploration, Scaffold-Building, Instrumentation, Pipefitting, Hand Tools, Power Tools, Construction Drawing and Math, Welding, Plumbing, and Electrical.

All of the students that participate in this summer camp must pass a drug test. Students are required to wear blue jeans or khakis, leather foot-wear and a long sleeve shirt and are required to work every day during the camp. The Craft Training Center provides safety glasses as well as personal protective equipment for each activity.

The projected outcome of this camp is for the students to attain general knowledge of the crafts trades and learn about the requirements to become a journeyman craftsman. The students apply math and science skills in these activities and understand the need for and practice the rules of safety as outlined in industry standards.
